



The City of Livermore owns and operates Livermore Airport (KLVK), the Gateway to the Tri-Valley, as a fully user-funded enterprise fund. No General Fund money is used to finance Airport operations.

The Airport encompasses 644 acres in the northwest corner of Livermore, bordered by Hwy 580 on the north and the City of Pleasanton on the west. The Airport has 8 full-time employees all under the direction of the Airport Manager.

The Airport has 392 hangars and over 200 tie-down spots which house approximately 505 based aircraft. The Airport's tenant's herald from all over Northern California and beyond, but 33% are Livermore residents and 18% are Pleasanton residents.

KLVK was the 20th busiest airport in California (this includes all airports, such as Oakland, SFO, and LAX, as well) with 117,698 operations during 2015. Livermore Airport serves a large number of corporate clients; including, Costco, Safeway, Coca Cola, Chevron, Home Depot, Target, Les Schwab, Dollar General, Verizon, and many more. The Airport sold 626,262 gallons of fuel in 2015, of which 330,543 gallons were jet fuel.

The Airport is available to pilots 365 days per year and 24 hours per day, however, the Airport Commission and staff strongly encourage pilots to avoid operating between the hours of 10:00PM-6:00AM to preserve quiet time for its neighbors to the east and west. A total of 594 noise complaints were registered in 2015 (75.6% of which originated from Pleasanton households, 23.7% from Livermore households, and less than 1% by Dublin, San Ramon, or Danville residents).

The Airport holds an annual Airport Open House & Air Show which attracts approximately 5,000 people from the greater Bay Area. The Open House & Air Show is held on the first Saturday of October. The event includes aerial performances, static displays of vintage, experimental and warbird aircraft. The [Open House and Air Show](#) is a FREE event and everyone is invited to attend.
